

## Te Ātea Marinō

**TE ĀTEA MARINŌ (Whitiki Maurea) is part of the Waitemata District Health Board Mental Health Services Group and is contracted to provide alcohol and drug services from a cultural perspective across the three Auckland District Health Boards.**

TE ĀTEA MARINŌ – Ki te Tonga (South) is based in Manukau and is offering placements through this initiative at its service in Lambie Drive, Manukau.

This team supports Whai I te Ora (clients) throughout the Counties Manukau region by providing direct treatment and care coordination services into a large number of other Counties Manukau AOD providers.

### ▶ PLACEMENTS AVAILABLE

Two placements per year in total, at undergraduate or postgraduate levels, starting early each year.

Two kinds of placement are available:

- Block placements – 6 weeks+ for students who do not require face to face experience;
- Full year placements – for students requiring face to face experience

Students are expected to be on site a minimum of 2 days per week (16 hours/0.4 FTE). Preference is given to those students who require face to face clinical hours (i.e. those undertaking applied degrees in AOD, Counselling, Social Work), and who intend to go on and work in AOD. We would also expect students to already have been trained in micro-counselling skills.

### ▶ DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION

The deadline for application is not fixed, but students need to be ready to start by the end of March.

### ▶ WHAT MIGHT I EXPECT TO LEARN?

Students will become fully orientated and conversant with TE ĀTEA MARINŌ – Ki te Tonga (South) processes and clinical practice expectations.

In addition, they will receive:

- Quality supervision
- Training to use DHB IT systems
- Group and face to face work experience.
